Accomplishments:

School Safety Assessments:

Conducted 31 school safety assessments for 6 school districts (Okolona, South Pike, Tallahatchie, Greenwood, Coahoma, and New Albany) to include follow up technical assistance to bring the districts into compliance with accreditation standards for school safety.

Training:

Conducted or sponsored workshops wherein 3,848 personnel were trained at no cost to the school district or department. Workshops and conference subjects included:

- School Safety Planning
- Crisis Response Plan Development
- School Law and Policy Development
- Restraint Techniques and Issues for Educators
- Oleoresin Capsicum Certification
- School Safety Assessment
- Juvenile Threat Assessment Protocol.

Conducted training at 11 state, regional or national conferences. Training also includes certification training for 55 School Resource Officers and 69 School Safety Officers.

Crisis Disaster Assistance Team:

Responded to state emergency disaster declarations for Hurricane Ivan in September 2004. Responded to EOC activation for severe weather and flooding in November 2004 for Harrison, Hancock, and Pearl River County. The team also responded to Mize School District Tornado and a HAZMAT (mercury) incident at Harrison County High School. Responded to a student death in Hinds County School District in November 2004. Responded to a student death in Jefferson Davis County School District and a bomb threat in Canton School District in March 2005. Also responded to the State Emergency Nuclear Release Drill in March 2005.
